Lesson Title: Website Evaluation

Burning Question: How can we tell if the resources we are using are reliable, accurate or best for our needs?

Objectives: Using the form, students will have a reliable process to assess the reliability of the websites that they are using for their research.

Context: For use after topics have been decided, before researching.

Materials: Handout, computers

Time Span: 1-2 class periods

Procedures:

- Using modeling, teacher should show a website that relates to their class but that is not reliable.
- Teachers should also show one that is reliable, perhaps a government site. Students should fill out the forms individually.
- Then pair students together to discuss their findings. Students should discuss where they agreed and disagreed and what support they used to prove it.
- Students should then briefly present their findings to the class.
- After discussion have students use these forms to assess the websites that they are investigating for their research.

Extensions: Students could share their result with each other and discover more ways to judge web sources

Rationale: Information literacy is a key skill for students and needs direct instruction.
